Key Vocabulary

Running stitch – a needlework stitch consisting of a line of small even stitches which run back and forth.

Blanket stitch – A buttonhole stitch used on the edges of a blanket or other material too thick to be hemmed.

Prototype – A first version of a product.

Cross-sectional and exploded diagram – A design that shows the relationship and order of the different parts.

Sturdy – Strong

Overlap – A method which involves the needle holes going straight through the fabric from top to bottom without the fabric being folded.
